


Out of **55**, four camps were related to awareness camp where assigned doctors spread awareness regarding oral health camps & total number of people was treated in these camps are **4133**.




Different areas, different people, different experience but thing is common — The heartfelt work of Shrinivas Sarvamangalam Society.



So that they can avail the benefits. The adding advantage is for the people that they can take treatment with 50-70% discount. It aids the unprivileged people to get proper coverage. Total 1216 unprivileged patients are treated under this referral case.

Medicines are considered as the cure for every illness. The signs have developed so much that every disease can be cured using medications. The medicines prescribed in the camps are:

Antibiotics for cure of any infections and as precautionary measures.

Analgesics for pain relief and inflammation.

Antacids for post operative relief from gastric problems

Multi vitamins to improve gut health.

Examples of medicines provided in camps-**Nimox Cv** and various other **Amoxicillin** as antibiotics .**Iceflame** and **Diclofenac** as analgesics.**Aciloc** and **Rantac** as antacids.



Dental Caries

- Very Common More than 10 Million cases per year (India)
- Permanently Damaged areas in teeth that develop into tiny holes.
- Causes include bacteria, snacking, sipping sugary, and poor teeth cleaning.

Gingivitis

- Very Common More than 1 Million cases per year (India)
- Gum Disease that causes inflamed gums
- Cause is poor oral hygiene. Untreated gingivitis can lead to tooth loss and other serious condition.

Root Stumps

- Root Stump is the remaining portion of a tooth's root that's left in the socket after the crown has fallen off.
- Root stumps can be a source of infection and may cause an abscess if left untreated.



Fluorosis

- Very Common More than 15 Million cases per year (India)
- A condition that results in white or brown speckles on teeth
- It's caused by overexposure to fluoride in the early years of life, when permanent teeth are developing.

Periodontitis

- Very Common More than 10 Million cases per year (India)
- Serious gum infection that damages gums and can destroy the jawbone.
- Causes include poor oral hygiene. It is a risk factor for heart and lung diseases.

Retained Deciduous

- Over-retention of deciduous teeth.
- A dental anomaly in which one or more primary teeth persist beyond their expected exfoliation.
- This condition hinders the proper eruption of permanent teeth and can alter their eruption path.



Wasting Diseases

- Any gradual loss of tooth substance characterized by the formation of smooth, polished surfaces.
- The forms of wasting are: erosion, Abrasion, attrition, & Abfraction
- Caused by prions, which are misfolded proteins that disrupt the nervous system

Apical Periodontitis

- The local inflammation of the periapical tissues that originate from pulp diseases.
- Occur due to the advancement of dental caries, trauma, or operative dental procedures.

Chronic generalised Gingivitis

- Very Common More than 1 Million cases per year (India)
- Abnormal alignment of the upper and lower teeth.
- Happens due to childhood habits or jaw is too small compared with the size of the teeth.



Partially Edentulous

- cases where some, but not all teeth are lost, resulting in an incomplete dentition.
- Oral infections such as gingivitis and dental caries (cavities) cause edentulous. Other common causes are bone loss and poor oral hygiene. These diseases destroy the gums and bones that hold teeth in place, causing teeth to fall out.

Centre of the Incisive Papilla (CIP)

Used as an anatomic landmark for anterior teeth
